CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT

There is no doubt this season will go down in our club's history as greatly disappointing on one hand, but extremely encouraging on the other. To miss out in three competitions at the final hurdle, in the manner we did, is heartbreaking, especially as we had done so well to get where we had.

Moments chance games, a cliché that is often used in sport, but this was typical of our luck. After reaching the final of the league cup for the first time in our club's history and achieving a reasonable score batting first we looked to get early wickets with our successful pace attack of Richie Sherlock and Jamie Went. Unfortunately Jamie pulled a hamstring just as their innings was starting and could not bowl, and therefore dented our response severely, we lost by five wickets. Our 20 – 20 season was again eventful. There is no doubt 20 – 20 Cricket at Harrow Lodge is special, with the atmosphere and entertainment as good as ever this year. Having reached the final again for the third time in four years we played Colchester in the first match. Batting first we got off to a great start being 26-0 in the 2nd over, however, in the next two over's we lost Chris Gladwin run out to an incredible piece of fielding and Paul Murray and Darren Robinson to equally good catches, we did not recover from that position and lost quite easily.

Without doubt the most frustrating and heartbreaking situation arose in the final week of our league season. Having played well as a unit throughout we went into the final game thinking all we needed was to win to achieve promotion to the Premiership. After successfully doing just that, we became aware that Chelmsford also thought they had gained promotion. Within the following few weeks much letter writing and debate took place, the outcome being we were deducted two points for a late result sheet and Umpire card for an earlier week, which meant we remained in Division one.

The fact that the envelope providing those sheets was seen by a Post Office Jobsworth to be slightly over the permitted thickness due to the sheets being folded four times rather than three, was the reason it was not delivered and kept at the Post Office. There are many issues appertaining to this which begged questions and although of no use to us this year, much needed changes to the score sheets collation were made at the league meeting.

It's typical of our season that a non cricketing incident cost us a place in the premiership.

There is no doubt under the Captaincy of Paul Murray our 1st Team had a very good season. His contribution with the bat was outstanding, particularly as in July he broke his fingers, but still played in every match scoring several centuries.

Our 2nd & 3rd IX had seasons of stability with a number of youngsters proving they are more than capable of playing that level. None more so than young Michael Bone who produced several impressive innings.

The 4th IX like other years topped their league throughout the season, only to lose it on the last cricketing day of the season. One remarkable innings came from youngster Stephen Edward who managed to hit 34 in one over, a club record I would think. Our 5th & 6th Team did well this year. These teams were again made up of youngsters many gaining vital experience as well as contributing admirably.

The most encouraging sign for me last season was seeing so many of our colts doing well in league cricket. In the six years our "Cricket for All" Coaching Programme has been in place, we have discovered an abundance of talented youngsters, none more so than Billy Gordon, who made his first team debut and impressed greatly in our league cup final. Well done to all, let's hope all remain committed to practice and our club.

The success in our youth cricket is to a large extent due to our coaches and managers who look after our colts team. Many give up considerable time throughout the season and I sincerely thank them for all they continue to do. May I be forgiven for giving a special mention to Paul Murray our head coach, always enthusiastic, totally committed to our youth, a great example to all.

To continue to move forward we need more help in a number of departments. All members have a duty to put something back into our club and I sincerely hope more will do just that next season. Our AGM is on the 7th December and would urge you all to attend.

With Christmas quickly approaching, may I wish you all a very happy and enjoyable time and all the very best for the New Year.

We look forward to the 2009' season being kinder to Hornchurch Cricket Club.

1983 to 2008 – The last 25 years

As it's the Club's 225 year in existence I thought it might be a good idea to look back at the last 25 years.

Bi-Centenary Year

Has it really been twenty five years since that wonderful celebration during 1983?

It was a week of great excitement and anticipation, will the weather hold, do we have enough beer?

The MCC flag flew high and proud over the pavilion – the first time we played them was in 1789, whether there was a flag or indeed we had a pavilion in those days is something we can only speculate on.

Matches against Woodford Green and perennial rivals Upminster followed those against a Hornchurch Old Boys XI and the Essex Cricket Association Presidents XI. The Thursday saw the turn of the Colts with a fixture against Ilford. The visitors emerged victors, mainly due to a very small young lad whose led spinners totally wrecked the Hornchurch batting – I wonder what even happened to him?, his name was Nasser Hussain.

The last game was the highlight with England Ladies providing the opposition. It was reported that in 1831 in a match at Langtons versus the MCC a crowd of over 3,000 lined the boundary. There was nowhere near that number but it must have been the biggest crowd to watch a match at Harrow Lodge. This pleased the then Treasurer – Mick Gaulter, whose early predictions on the bar takings were easily surpassed.

The week was over, gradually the excitement died down and it was back to the bread and butter cricket for the next twenty five years – or so we thought. Little did we realise what was in store for the club over the coming years

Brighton TourS of the eighthies

In 1985 and to alleviate our Bi-Centenary blues a tour to Brighton was arranged. A number of the emerging Colts came along as they had said that they had grown up and were worthy of a place on the tour – why did we believe them?

Anything organised by Ray Brookes is sure to be run like a well oiled machine, but even he couldn't have envisaged the few spanners in the works conjured up of course by those grown up youngsters.

A First World War bugle was purchased by Howard Mayes which he attempted to play in the early hours of the morning. A rather pathetic attempt at "Reveille" and "Come to the Cookhouse Door" rang out over the Hotel square from his bedroom window annoying the residents and offering great distress to all music lovers.

It was from the very same bedroom window that Graham 'Clubber' Cubitt decided to perform his Tarzan routine. He appeared in front of the window dressed in only a pair of Y fronts.

He was observed doing this death defying feat by Howards wife Ann, Graham thought his luck had changed, but to his dismay he was greeted by Ann with a jug of cold water which she promptly poured over him, which to a very large degree cooled his 'antics.

More strange occurrences seemed to happen when on successive mornings a wrought iron table and chairs that had previously gone missing from the front of a nearby seaside café were found neatly placed on top of a large white van parked opposite the Hotel entrance. When this happened on consecutive mornings the complaints meant that the following morning sighs of relief rang out when looking outside of the windows we saw the van without it's additional seating. However, marching down to breakfast there, right in the middle of the Hotel foyer – yes you've guessed it a wrought iron table and chairs.

On one tour stalwart Doug Shewring was also confronted with a couple of things he couldn't lay his hands on.

As is customary on tour if you don't perform well on the pitch you get to wear an obscene hat. Well, Doug had that honour after one tour match and later that evening was entertaining guests in the Hotel bar wearing said hat when he was confronted by a policewoman. He was told he was in trouble for wearing a rather offensive hat in public. Doug as he usually does protests to no avail and the woman says she must take down a few notes, reaches into her now unbuttoned tunic to reveal that she was a stripogram. As Doug revealed later, he was faced with the biggest "pair" he had confronted since he was bowled first ball in both innings of an all day game in the early eighties.
